

B問題

第 四 問 高校生の由香里とALTのクーパー先生 (Mr. Cooper) が次のような会話をしています。
この英文を読んで、あとの1～6の問いに答えなさい。

Yukari: I hope I can work as an international volunteer someday. I hear you were working as a volunteer in Africa. Could you tell me what you were doing?

Mr. Cooper: OK. I was working in Sierra Leone. Have you ever heard of it?

Yukari: Yes, it's a country in Africa.

Mr. Cooper: That's right. In Sierra Leone, there were wars, and a lot of people were injured or died. Many babies and little children couldn't get enough food and became sick.

I was taking care of the people working for that school.

Yukari: That's wonderful!

Mr. Cooper: Yes, it is! But many international volunteers often have two problems. Knowing about them is very important when we think about international volunteer work.

Yukari: What is ① the first problem?

Mr. Cooper: The lives of the local people we support and our lives are very different, so understanding their lives is difficult.

Yukari: What do you mean?

Mr. Cooper: For example, usually there are few schools for the local people. Many children can't go to school, and they don't know how to read and write. So volunteers make a school for children. But when volunteers finish building it, sometimes they can't come to school.

Yukari: Why does it happen?

Mr. Cooper: Because people are very poor, their children must work, too. We think that going to school is more important than working for money. But they don't think so. They think that B. So children can't come to school.

Yukari: That sounds difficult to me. What is the second problem?

Mr. Cooper: Volunteers can't stay at one place for a long time. They must leave someday. But then hospitals and schools stop working without people who can manage them. So the local people must manage them. Volunteers must teach them how to do so.

Yukari: It sounds difficult, too.

Mr. Cooper: That's true. So, from these two problems, it C do international volunteer work. It is a very rewarding job, but we need a lot of patience.

Yukari: But I still want to help those people in need. Is there anything I can do now?

Mr. Cooper: You can study things happening in the world. And you must study the language that many volunteers from many countries can understand and use. I mean the language we're speaking now.

Yukari: I got it. I will study English harder.
